Why do I need Training?

Training is the key to ensuring that the boys in your Troop receive the best possible quality Scouting experience. A fun, quality Scouting program will keep your boys involved longer, allowing them to benefit more greatly from the values and lessons of Scouting.

There are 5 steps to being a trained leader or parent in Scouting:

1. Youth Protection Training
2. Fast Start
3. This Is Scouting
4. Leader Specific Training
5. Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (SM & ASM only)

Additionally, there are opportunities for “supplemental” training that will help you take Scouting in your Troop to the next level:

1. Roundtable
2. University of Scouting
3. Wood Badge
4. Weather Hazard Awareness
5. Safe Swim / Safety Afloat

On-Line Training

Getting Started:

- go to www.myscouting.org
- If this is your first time visiting this site you will need to select create an account under "New to my Scouting?" and follow the instructions to set up your account.
- Once your account is created enter your user name and password and complete the training in the following order.

Online: Youth Protection

- Once you are into the site click on E-Learning (on left menu) and then on the General tab. Scroll down to *Youth Protection* and click Take Course.

Online: Fast Start

- Once you are into the site click on E-Learning (on left menu) and then on the Boy Scout tab. Scroll down to *Fast Start* and click Take Course on the specific *Fast Start* course you need. (Scoutmaster, Committee Member, etc.)

Online: This is Scouting

- Once you are into the site click on E-Learning (on left menu) and then on the General tab. Scroll down to *This is Scouting* and click Take Course.

Online: Troop Committee Challenge

- Once you are into the site click on E-Learning (on left menu) and then on the Boy Scout tab. Scroll down to Troop Committee Challenge and click Take Course.

What's Next?

- If you are a new leader, type your name and print your completion certificate as temporary proof of training. Keep a copy, give one copy to your Troop Trainer and send one copy to Tracy Winsor at apokashorestraining@gmail.com. Once you receive your BSA Membership Card, log back in and click on *My Profile*. Enter your Member ID and this will link your training records to your membership.
- If you are a current leader renewing or taking online training for the first time, log in and enter your BSA Membership ID number on *My Profile*. Your training records will update automatically. If you do not have your BSA Membership Card, please request one through the Registrar at the Central Florida Council Office.
